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<p><b>Discussion</b> (including relationship to other Council actions)</p> <p>There has been an increase in the number of grocery stores and convenience grocery stores that are selling liquor by the drink throughout the United States. As grocery stores look for new ways to bring in shoppers, one innovation has been the addition of beer and wine bars as well as selling alcoholic beverages within restaurants located onsite. Two examples of this are Whole Foods Markets and Hy-Vee grocery stores.</p> <p>Based on this, there are grocery stores and convenience stores in Kansas City, Missouri that have expressed interest in having a retail sales by drink license. A retail sales-by-drink license also allows the license holder to sell alcoholic beverages by the package. However, any store that sells gasoline, is a gasoline service station, or is a motor vehicle repair garage does not qualify to receive a retail sales-by-drink license.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u><a href="#">CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE</a></u></p>															

**Details****Policy / Program Impact**

<p>Even though there is no longer a minimum percentage for alcoholic beverages sold by the drink on a retail sales by drink licensed premise, this ordinance change continues to protect the neighborhoods because anyone that applies for any type of sales-by-drink license cannot display, store or arrange alcoholic beverages in public view anywhere on the licensed premises unless they have met the retail sales-by-package density requirement.</p> <p>Missouri state statutes already allow any grocery store, convenience grocery store, general merchandising store and confectionary store to apply for any type of retail sales by drink license which also allows for the sale of liquor by the package. There are convenience stores, grocery stores and liquor stores located throughout the state of Missouri that are already operating under this concept whereby they have a retail sales-by-drink license to sell alcoholic beverages by the drink to customers while still having the ability to sell liquor by the package throughout the rest of their store.
